

AUTHOR GUIDELINES FOR 8.27 X 11.69-INCH (A4) PROCEEDINGS MANUSCRIPTS

Abstract

The abstract is to be in fully-justified italicized text, at the top of the left-hand column as it is here, below the author information. Use the word “Abstract” as the title, in 10-point Times, boldface type, centered relative to the column, initially capitalized. The abstract is to be in 10-point, single-spaced type, and up to 150 words in length. Leave one blank line after the abstract, then begin the main text.

1. Introduction

All manuscripts must be in English. These guidelines include complete descriptions of the fonts, spacing, and related information for producing your proceedings manuscripts.

2. Formatting your paper

All printed material, including text, illustrations, and charts, must be kept within a print area of 6.25 inches wide by 9.5 inches high. Do not write or print anything outside the print area. All *text* must be in a two-column format. Columns are to be 3.125 inches wide, with a 0.425 inch space between them. Text must be fully justified.

A format sheet with the margins and placement guides is available as both Word and PDF files as <format.doc> and <format.pdf>. It contains lines and boxes showing the margins and print areas. If you hold it and your printed page up to the light, you can easily check your margins to see if your print area fits within the space allowed.

3. Main title

The main title (on the first page) should begin 1.0 inch from the top edge of the page, centered, and in Times 12-point, boldface capital type. Leave one 12-point blank lines after the title.

4. Author name(s) and affiliation(s)

Author names and affiliations are to be centered beneath the title and printed in Times 11-point, boldface italic type. Multiple authors may be shown in one format, and their affiliations are non-italic size 10, not bold and centered below their names. Include

e-mail addresses in one line. Author information should be followed by one 10-point lines.

5. Second and following pages

The second and following pages should begin 1.0 inch (2.54 cm) from the top edge. On all pages, the bottom margin should be, for A4 paper, approximately 1.0 inches (2.54 cm) from the bottom edge of the page.

6. Type-style and fonts

Wherever Times is specified, Times Roman or Times New Roman may be used. If neither is available on your word processor, please use the font closest in appearance to Times. Avoid using bit-mapped fonts if possible. True-Type 1 fonts are preferred.

7. Main text

Type your main text in 10-point Times, single-spaced. Do **not** use double-spacing. All paragraphs should be aligned left, not be indented. Be sure your text is fully justified, that is, flush left and flush right. Please do not place any additional blank lines between paragraphs.

Figure and table captions with callout should be 10-point times new roman non-boldface. Initially capitalize only the first word of each figure caption and table title. Figures and tables must be numbered separately. For example: Figure 1. Database contexts, and Table 1. Input data. Figure captions are to be centered below the figures. Table titles are to be centered above the tables.

8. First-order headings

For example, “1. Introduction”, should be Times 10-point boldface, initially capitalized, flush left, with one blank line before. Use a period (“.”) after the heading number, not a colon.

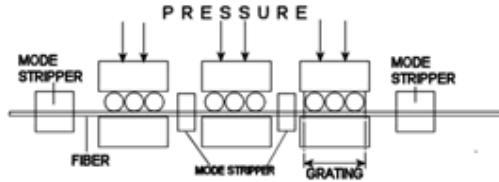


Fig.3: LD- MCVD SMF coupling using a conical microlens, taking into account the effect of multiple reflection between the laser and SMF facets.

8.1. Second-order headings

As in this heading, they should be Times 10-point boldface, initially capitalized, flush left, with one blank line before.

8.1.1. Third-order headings. Third-order headings, as in this paragraph, are discouraged. However, if you must use them, use 10-point Times, boldface, initially capitalized, flush left, preceded by one blank line, followed by a period and your text on the same line.

9. Footnotes

Is not required at all to use

10. References

List and number all bibliographical references in 10 point Times, single-spaced, at the end of your paper. When referenced in the text, enclose the citation number in square brackets, for example [1]. Where appropriate, include the name(s) of editors of referenced books.
